

# Index - All Volumes

## Please Note:

This index is derived from the insertion of codes into the text that the typesetting software then collates. This is a 'snapshot' of a work in progress and there is material to be added and a number of points to be clarified. Indexing codes have not yet been inserted in a comprehensive manner. This means that if something is not included in the index at this point, it does not mean it is not yet in the chronology.

To make the editing and compilation process easier, indexing codes have been inserted next to the date of an item, so it is possible that in long entries the actual event or person the indexing mark relates to may be over the page from the start of the entry.

If there are items on consecutive pages, the software combines the entries, e.g., 6-8 rather than 6, 7, 8. The index can be manually edited for the final publication version.

## Indexing of chemical and biological agents

Two issues arise in this area when it comes to indexing:

- There is no clear boundary between chemical and biological agents as there is a third grouping in the middle known as toxins — poisonous chemical substances produced by living organisms. This overlap ensures there is no gap in coverage in between international legal instruments. For the purposes of this index, toxins such as ricin and saxitoxin are indexed under 'biological weapons – types/agents'.
- For any biological weapon, there is a distinction between the disease, e.g., anthrax, and the causative agent, e.g., *B. anthracis*. For an index for this type of publication, drawing this distinction too subtly may cause confusion or direct the reader away from information they may seek. Therefore, this index combines both in the form <<disease (causative agent)>>, this renders the example given above as 'anthrax (*Bacillus anthracis*)'.

Indexing for Germany is as FRG & GDR for cold war years, and as Germany for post-reunification
